Annual Deadline: December 1, for study abroad in the spring semester of the following calendar year.

A semester abroad will contribute to increased linguistic and cultural proficiency in German. Knowledge of more than one's own culture and language is an invaluable asset in an increasingly globalized world. Students often testified how much they enjoyed studying a semester or a year in another country. For many, this is a life changing experience.
